

Results of the 2009 MLA Elections

Second Vice President

Michael Bérubé (Penn State Univ., University Park) was elected second vice president of the association. He will serve in that office from 1 January 2010 through the close of the January 2011 convention and will automatically become first vice president in 2011, serving in that office through the close of the January 2012 convention.
